### **SHIIP Medicare Counseling Savings**

Council on Aging's SHIIP team of volunteers and staff helped **679** individuals review and change Medicare plans during Medicare Open Enrollment, which saved those people a total of **\$290,902** for 2020! If you switched plans, your new coverage will start January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020.
